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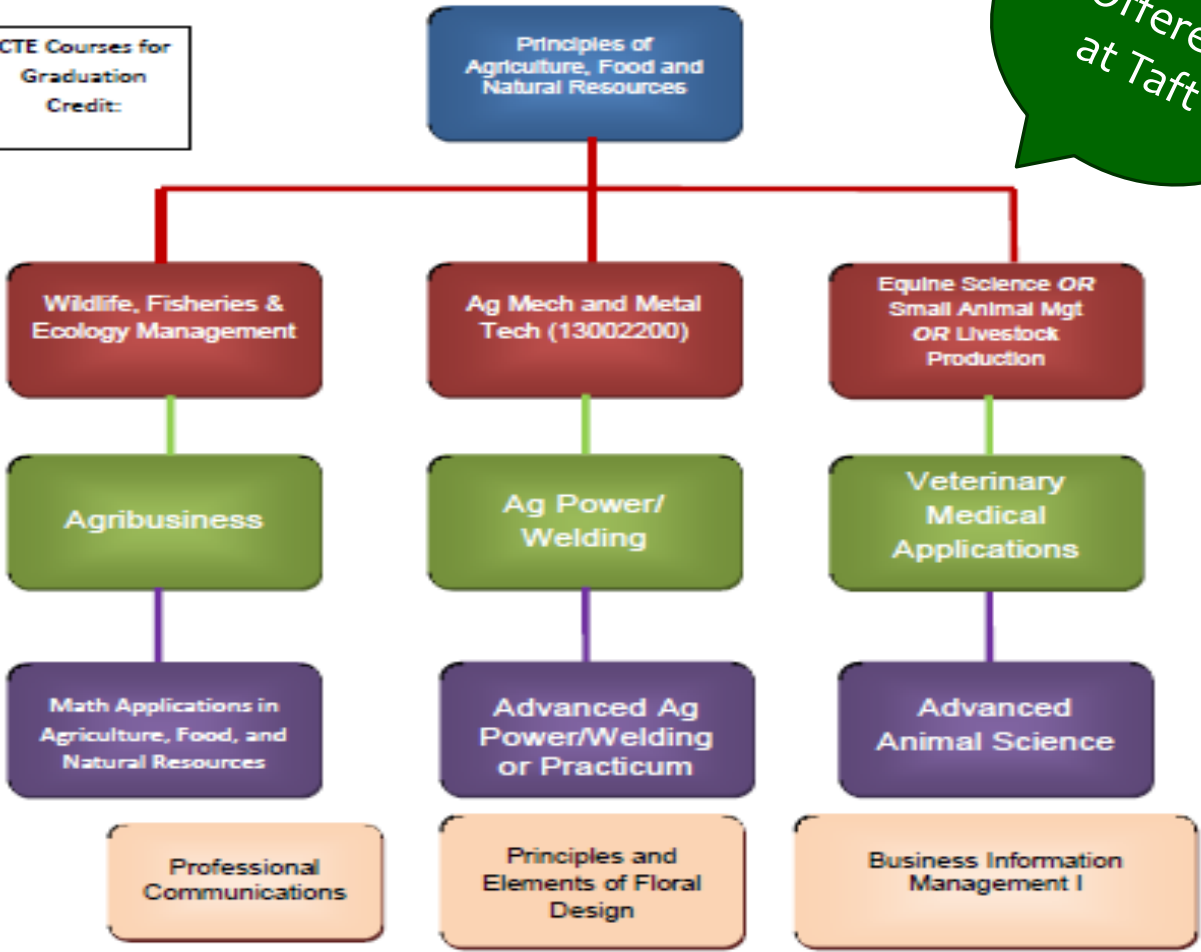

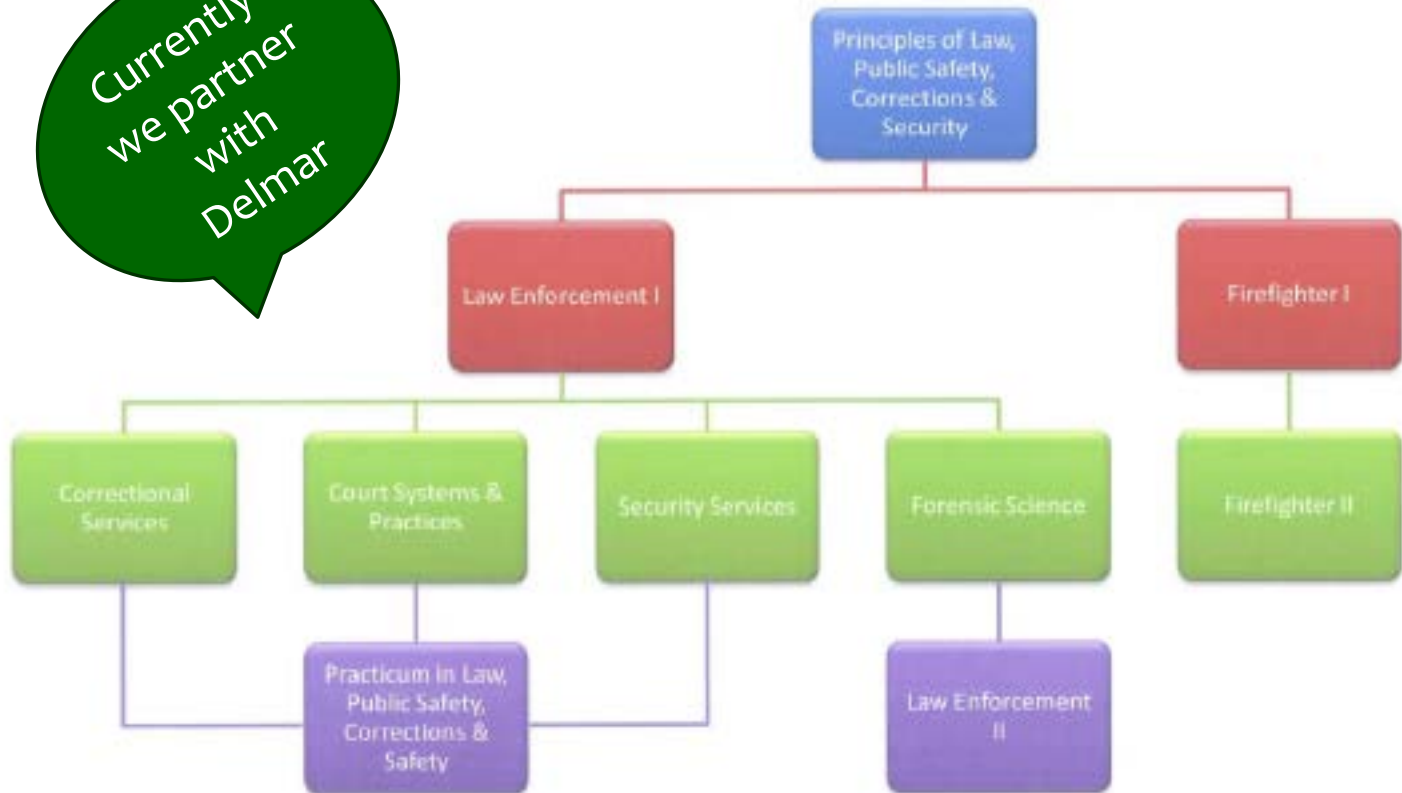

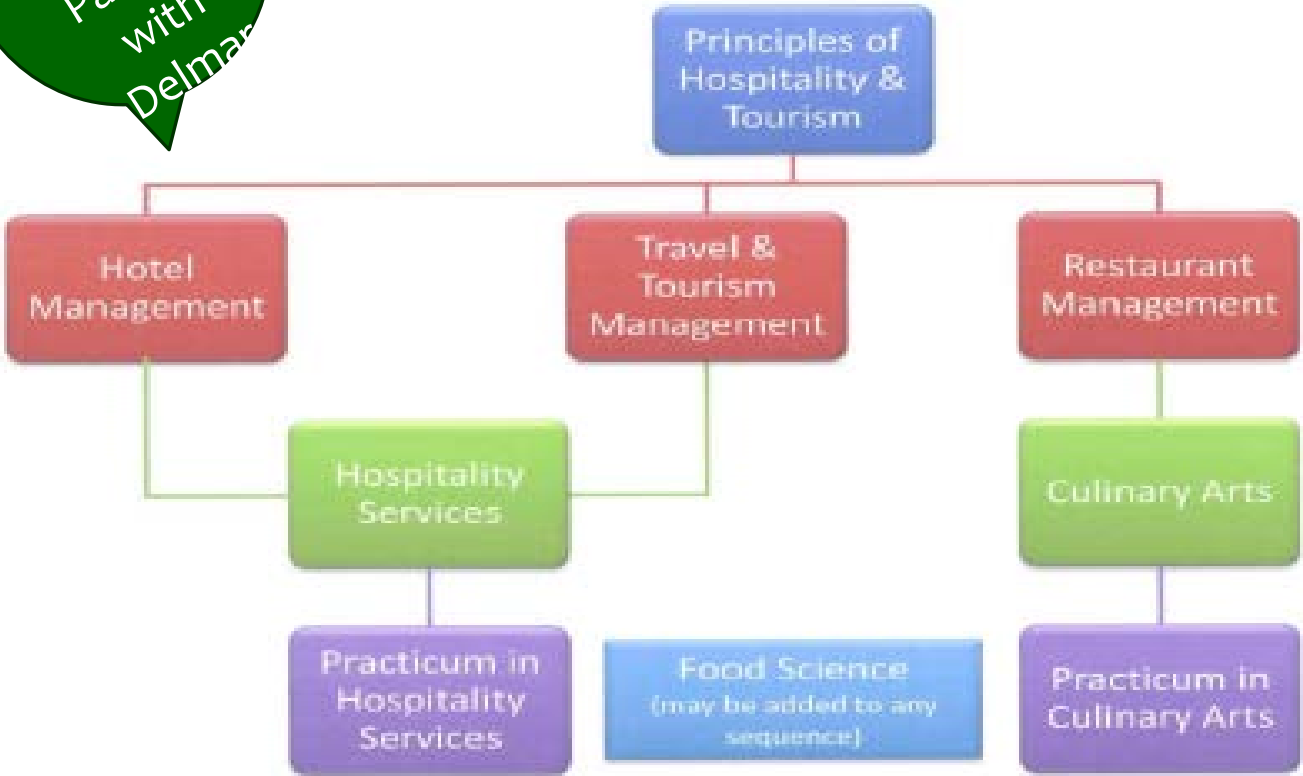

- * Start discussing college as a family.
- * Start saving for college if you haven't already.
- * Take challenging classes to prepare for high school.
- * Develop strong study habits.
- * Do your best in school and on standardized test.
- * Become involved in school or community

9th Grade

- * Take challenging classes in core subjects.
- * Get involved in school or community based activities
- * Do some career exploration
 - * U.S department of Labor's career search tool
- * Start a list of your awards, honors, paid and volunteer work, and extracurricular activities.

10th Grade

- * Consider taking a PSAT
- * Use your summer wisely: work, volunteer
- * Research majors that might be a good fit with your interest and goals.

11th Grade

- * Continue to explore careers and their potential
- * Research and learn about different colleges.
- * Take the PSAT
- * Take the SAT or ACT
- * Visit different college campuses

12th Grade

- * Keep grades up
- * Stay involved in after-school activities, and seek leadership roles if possible
- * Take SAT or ACT to if needed to improve score
- * Apply to colleges
- * Continue to visit college campuses
- * Round up recommendation letters
- * Fill out as many scholarships as possible
- * Complete income tax forms early.
- * As soon as possible after Jan 1, complete and submit the FAFSA.
- * Contact a school's financial aid office if you have questions about the aid that school has offered you.
